

Do I have to change my Medicare drug plan for next year if I have full Extra Help?

Extra Help, the federal program that helps pay most of your Medicare drug costs, will pay the full cost of your monthly drug plan premium as long as you are enrolled in a **basic drug plan whose monthly premium is at or below \$25.18 in 2008 in New York.**

If you enroll in a plan that has a premium above this amount, **you will have to pay the difference.**

- **If Medicare enrolled you** in a Medicare drug plan in 2007 that has a premium above \$25.18 in 2008, you will be switched to another, random plan for which Extra Help will pay your premium in full **unless you choose another plan yourself.** Medicare will send you a blue letter indicating which plan it will be enrolling you in.
- **If you chose a plan** in 2007 that will have a premium above \$25.18 in 2008, Medicare will **not** switch you to a different plan in 2008. You should switch to a plan that has a premium below this amount if you want to avoid paying a premium.

Whether you have to switch or not, you should look at all your plan options in 2008 to make sure that you enroll in the plan that covers all your prescriptions in 2008 and has the fewest barriers to getting them.

Note: If you live in New York, have Extra Help and **EPIC** drug coverage, you should **not** be reassigned by Medicare. For more information, call EPIC at 800-332-3742.
