Dear Senator Stabenow:

The undersigned organizations write to express our support for an amendment to the 2014 Senate Budget Resolution (S. Con. Res. 8) intended to "protect Medicare's guaranteed benefits and to prohibit Medicare vouchers or other efforts to privatize Medicare." Our organizations share a commitment to advancing the health and financial well-being of older adults, people with disabilities and their families.

Enacted in 1965, Medicare is the cornerstone of health and economic security care for older adults and people with disabilities. Today Medicare provides guaranteed health care benefits to 50 million Americans.¹ According to a recent national poll, <u>77%</u> of Americans reported that Medicare was personally important to their families, and <u>58%</u> opposed any spending cuts to Medicare.² Despite the program's success and widespread popularity, some lawmakers propose privatizing Medicare through the creation of a voucher (or premium support) program.

Under this privatization scheme, beneficiaries would receive a voucher to purchase health coverage in the private market. Replacing Medicare's guaranteed health benefits with a voucher would devastate the already fragile economic stability of older adults and people with disabilities. The value of the proposed voucher is unlikely to keep pace with health care inflation, thus burdening beneficiaries with added health care costs and the possibility that they could not afford a plan that includes their doctors. One analysis finds that six in ten people with Medicare would face higher costs under a premium support model.³

Yet, many people with Medicare cannot afford to pay more. Nearly 25 million beneficiaries—half of the Medicare population—live on annual incomes of \$22,500 or less. Further, people with Medicare already spend a significant amount on health care. The average Medicare household spends <u>15%</u> of their total income on health care expenses, <u>three</u> times that of non-Medicare households.⁴

The amendment offered by Senator Stabenow reflects Americans' strong desire to preserve the promise of Medicare. As shown by a recent national poll, most Baby Boomers and older adults—65% of those polled—prefer Medicare's guaranteed benefits to vouchers.⁵ For these reasons, we urge Senators to vote in favor of Senator Stabenow's amendment to protect Medicare beneficiaries from voucher payments. Thank you.
